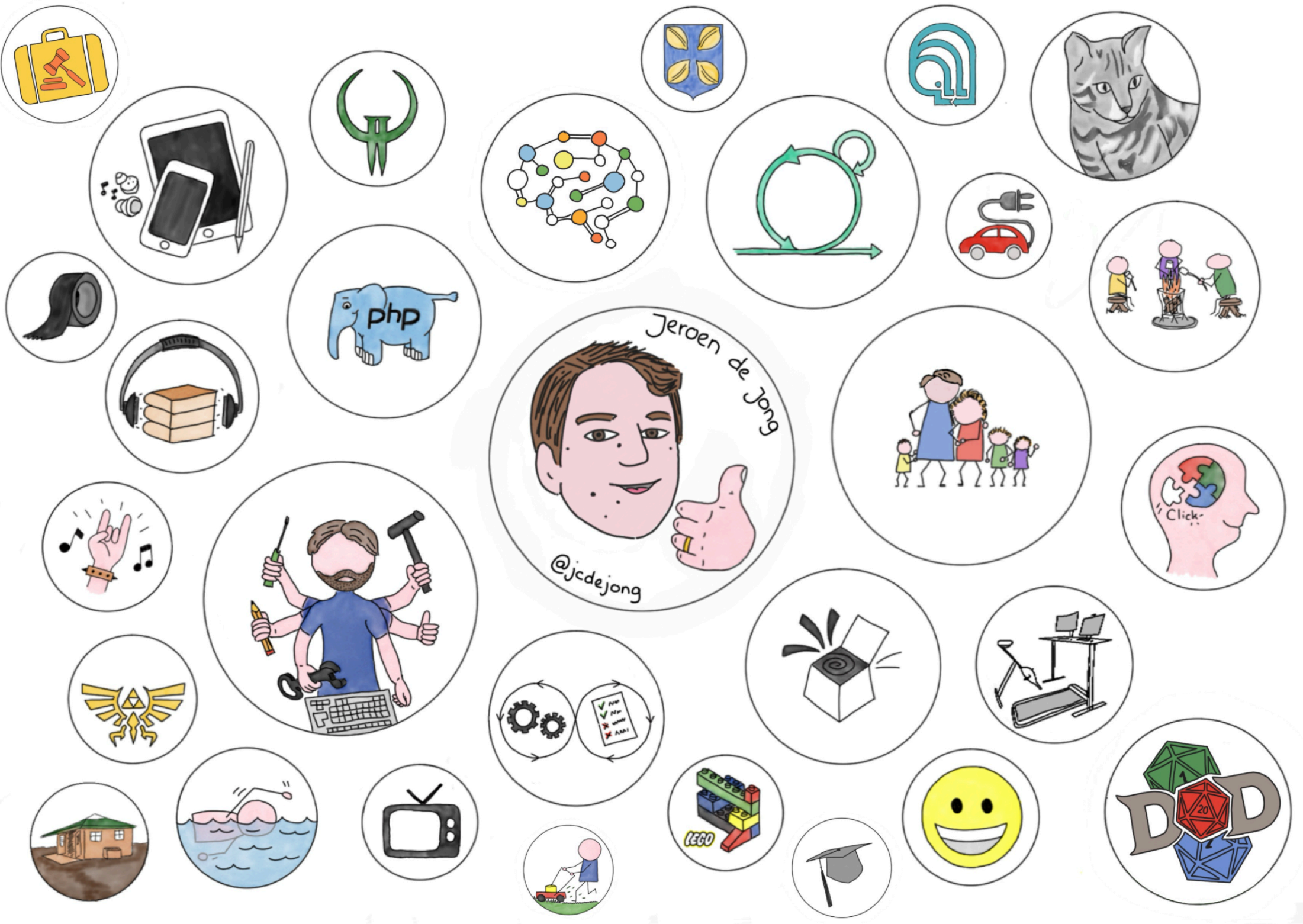

It not only explained why all my initial projects seemed to work so well. It also explained why things started to fail after our companies grew, even though we implemented the “professional practices” I learned in college.

The empirical process allowed me to do what needed to be done and made me a jack-of-all-trades. About 10 years ago, I was juggling too many balls across multiple companies. After reflecting on my diverse activities, I decided to focus on what truly energizes me: inspiring and guiding others to overcome challenges by leveraging my strengths in facilitation, mentoring, and problem-solving.

I am dedicated to sharing my knowledge and experiences, aiming to give others the same excitement and joy I felt in my early career. My goal is to help build teams that thrive on collaboration and success.

I love learning, trying new things, and sharing my knowledge with others. I'm actively involved in the global Agile community, attending and organizing meetups and public workshops. I helped our company create a system for personalized online video messages, including santavideo.com, videoperenoel.com, persoonlijkevideo.ajax.nl, and videovansint.nl.

Initially, I fulfilled the role of Product Owner and collaborated with a third party who would develop the website and system. Unfortunately, we had to conclude that the company was unable to deliver the required system in time. At that point, I switched to the role of Developer and connected with an old colleague, with whom we developed the MVP, which we used to deliver over 30.000 personalized videos to the customers of De Club van Sinterklaas in 2014.

In the years that followed, we improved the system and developed mobile applications as a fully remote team. Since 2018 I've handed over my tasks and only focused as a System Administrator on hosting all services.

We did not follow any particular agile framework, but I facilitated events that resemble a Retrospective and Review where needed. I implemented DevOps practices, like code reviews, pair programming, trunk-based development, continuous integration, and continuous deployment. And we tracked the progress of our work and the backlog first in YouTrack and later in ClickUp.

Currently, the company only operates seasonal products, and I reduced my involvement to a minimum.

JANUARY 2007 - SEPTEMBER 2017

We started the company E-engine as a joint venture between Rotor Solutions and Emesa. The role I fulfilled can be considered a DevOps engineer. Until 2010 I helped build the system, scaled the servers, and shaped the organization, allowing us to become a competitive Email Service Provider in the Netherlands and serving customers like Roompot Vakantieparken, ID&T, Telegraaf Media Group, Social Deal, Groupdeal, and BMW.

In 2014 I started working again for the company. As Solution Architect, I created the plans to move a newly developed product called DMARC Analyzer into the AWS cloud. And I made a proposition on how we could achieve the ISO 27001 / ISAE3402 certifications. As an Email Deliverability Expert, I advised on how we could increase the deliverability of our emails and that of our customers. As an Agile Coach, I introduced Kanban, coached the Product Owner and Development team. And I made sure we started using a Continuous Delivery pipeline and other DevOps practices.

In June 2017, I stopped working for the company, and I eventually sold my shares in May 2018.

All Scrum Accountabilities (et al.) — NL — eFuture Group

FEBRUARY 2005 - JUNE 2017

The eFuture Group consisted of different companies for which I worked via my own companies, Rotor Solutions, and Allict. Examples of companies are Beurswatch, eFuture, Emesa (vakantievervelingen.nl), AdQuest, AtNoon, 5MinutenTV, Happybee, OneDream (jiggy.nl), Wikimix, VoordeelVanger, De Verzekeringsvergelijker.nl, and MyFlavours.

I am most proud of VakantieVeilingen.nl, which originated from a marketing campaign that I devised with Michael van Beers, and I helped grow into a successful company until it was sold in 2011.

Within the eFuture Group, we tried implementing the Holacracy framework, and therefore most people had multiple responsibilities. Depending on the project's need, I fulfilled almost all technical roles imaginable over the years, ranging from Customer Support to IT Manager. Since 2011 my focus has been on the three roles described in the Scrum Guide. After 2015 I was mainly accountable as Agile Coach but still acted as a backup for the Developer, Solution Architect, and System Administrator roles.

Over the years, I've experimented with many project methods and frameworks (including Waterfall, DSDM, Lean Startup, Scrum, Kanban, and DevOps) and tools to track our work (including Mantis, JIRA, YouTrack, and Asana).

All Scrum Accountabilities (et al.) — Hilversum, NL — Live@ & 24LiveEDM

JANUARY 2011 - DECEMBER 2016

For Live@, we wanted to create a unique social platform for events and entertainment. Our users could enjoy the thrill of a new upcoming event with their friends, buy tickets online, check in, share and discover new events based on their personal preferences.

In 2010 I heard about the Scrum Framework, and in early 2011 I followed a Scrum Foundation workshop, after which I decided to give it a try for this new project. For the first year, I introduced the framework as a Scrum Master to our newly formed company. I encouraged the development team to use practices such as CI/CD and TDD. During that year, we also scaled up our workforce by collaborating with a team in India. After a year, I replaced the Product Owner and handed over my Scrum Master accountabilities to a colleague.

Unfortunately, we were unable to reach the number of customers we had hoped for. I've learned how important it is to release early and get feedback from real customers from this failure.

In early 2014 we tried rebooting the platform under the name 24LiveEDM with a smaller target audience. Although it looked promising, we couldn't make it a success.
